Kirkwood Workplace Learning Connection 18th Annual 8th Grade Student Financial Literacy Fair Volunteers needed to assist in Johsnon & Washington Counties Various Dates in April

Workplace Learning Connection is again partnering with middle schools for this interactive budgeting experience. In the classroom students learn about career paths, budgeting basics, and financial well-being. Based on their interests they select a career, determine their monthly income, and develop a virtual budget.

The Fair brings together important financial concepts and provides an impactful budgeting practice based on each students' financial choices.

You are invited to talk with 12-14 year old students for 3 hours. A brief training is provided. Previous experience and budgeting expertise are not required. Your volunteer time is key to making this a powerful learning experience.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is a national IRS sponsored program that provides free tax preparation of federal and state tax returns for households with income less than \$64,000.

Volunteers are critical to the success of the VITA program. VITA volunteers help complete and file tax returns for those who have a limited income. On average, it costs a taxpayer nearly \$300 to have taxes done. This money can instead be used for basic needs such as groceries and rent.

Volunteer opportunities include Greeters and Tax Preparers and shifts are flexible January through mid-April. No tax experience is required. Online training sessions are provided and required.
