

Volunteers are critical to the success of the VITA program. VITA volunteers help complete and file tax returns for those who have a limited income. On average, it costs a taxpayer nearly \$300 to have taxes done. This money can instead be used for basic needs such as groceries and rent.

Volunteer opportunities include Greeters and Tax Preparers and shifts are flexible January through mid-April. No tax experience is required. Online training sessions are provided and required.







Through food recovery & redistribution, Table to Table (T2T) helps thousands of our Johnson County neighbors annually. This year, we distributed 2.7 million pounds of food, three fifths of which was highly-sought after produce, protein, and dairy. This year marks 33+ million pounds of food rescued since 1996. We collect food from 200 local donors from across the food system and distribute millions of pounds of food to 46 recipient nonprofit social service agencies at no cost to them. These partners include youth organizations, food pantries, meal sites, shelters, housing organizations and other agencies.
